

# Downtown Public Art Walk turn by turn directions

#### Start on Kleman Plaza at

1. The Sunday Paper by W. Stanley "Sandy" Proctor, Bronze, 2005 Kleman Plaza

#### Walk south to the

2. Miami Beach Ball by Romero Britto, Painted Aluminum, 2005 Kleman Plaza

#### Turn west (right) and walk down Pensacola. Turn south (left) onto Bronough.

- 3. Movin' On by Bradley Cooley and Bradley Cooley, Jr., Bronze, 2005 R.A. Gray Building
- 4. <u>American Royalty</u> by Bradley Cooley and Bradley Cooley, Jr., Bronze, 2007 R.A. Gray Building
- 5. <u>Seminole Family</u> by Bradley Cooley and Bradley Cooley, Jr., Bronze, 2006 R.A. Gray Building

### Turn west (right) onto the plaza of the R.A. Gary Building and walk down the stairs (the mural may also be seen from the plaza level).

6. <u>Wakulla River During the Paleoindian Period</u> by F.A.C.E. Community Volunteers, 2004, Museum of Florida History

#### Walk back up the stairs and continue south (right) onto Bronough.

- 8. <u>Florida's World War II Monument</u> by Harvard, Jolly, Clees, Toppe Architects, Granite and Metal Markers, 2005

### Continue south on Bronough. to Madison. and turn east (left) crossing Bronough (to maintain your course on the sidewalk). Continue south on Bronough to Gaines.

- 9. <u>Birds Bus Shelter</u> by Mark Dickson for the City of Tallahassee/Star Metro, Welded, polished aluminum, 2013, NE intersection of S. Bronough and Gaines
- 10. <u>Gaines Street Tree Wall</u> by Susan Stelzmann with poetry by Mary Jane Ryals, Ceramic, 2011, Gaines Street between Duval and Bronough

### Continue on Gaines and cross Duval. Then turn north (left) and continue north on Duval. Turn east (right) and walk up the steps of the Capitol.

11. <u>Stormsong</u> by Hugh Bradford Nicholson, Stainless Steel and Recycled Aluminum, 2003, West Terrace of Florida Capitol

#### Veer to the right (Senate side), around the Capitol building to the Courtyard.

Turn north (left) and continue north towards the House building.

- 12. Officer Down by Michael Jernigan, Bronze, 2009, Capitol Courtyard
- 13. <u>Florida Law Enforcement Monument</u>, Dedicated to fallen law enforcement officers of Florida by the Florida Fraternal Order of Police, 2000 Florida Historic Capitol
- 14. Florida Martin Luther King Memorial, 1984, Florida Historic Capitol
- 15. Florida Fallen Firefighter Memorial, dedicated in 2015, Capitol Courtyard

### Continue east, then turn south (right) and continue walking in front of the Historic Capitol.

16. Parkhill Monument, 1861, Florida Historic Capitol

Turn east (left) and continue across S. Monroe onto Apalachee Parkway. Turn south (right) onto Calhoun. Continue on Calhoun. to Madison. and turn east (left), crossing Calhoun. (to maintain your course on the sidewalk). Continue south on Calhoun.

17. <u>Leon County Schools Wall of Remembrance</u>, This memorial honors former Leon County School students who gave their lives serving in a combat environment in the armed forces since 1991. Engraved Granite, Unveiled June 5, 2013

### Turn west (right) onto Gaines. Turn north (right) onto Monroe. Continue north on Monroe.

- 18. <u>Florida Vietnam Veterans Memorial</u> by James R. Kolb, Granite, 1985, Southeast Corner of Monroe Street and Apalachee Parkway
- 19. <u>POW-MIA Memorial</u>, 2021, Southeast Corner of Monroe Street and Apalachee Parkway
- 20. <u>World War II Veteran's Memorial</u> by W. Stanley "Sandy" Proctor, Bronze, 2001, Leon County Courthouse
- 21. <u>Tribute to Those Killed by Drunk Drivers</u> by Elsie Shaw, Copper, 1998, Leon County Courthouse

### Continue north on Monroe and turn west (left) onto Call. Turn north (right) onto Adams.

22. <u>Hold Fast to Dreams Mural</u> by F.A.C.E. Community Volunteers, 1995, Bus Terminal/Parking Lot of Aloft Hotel

### Turn west (left) onto the northeast corner of the City Bus Terminal and then onto Tennessee.

23. <u>C.K. Steele Statue</u> by David Lowe Bronze, 1985, Tallahassee City Bus Terminal, C.K. Steele Plaza

24. <u>Bethel Windows</u>, Original stained glass panels from Bethel Church, Star Metro Bus Terminal

#### Continue west on Tennessee and turn south (left) on Duval.

25. <u>Electric Bus Charging Station Façade</u>, Cast blocks, unveiled July 09, 2013 City of Tallahassee/Star Metro

Turn east (left) on Call and then cross Adams and turn south (right) onto Adams. Turn east (left) onto E. College.

26. Gallie Alley Murals, 109 E College Ave.

### Continue on E. College and then turn south (right) onto Monroe. Turn west (right) onto Jefferson.

27. <u>Civil Rights Heritage Walk</u>, Terrazzo sidewalk fabricated and installed by the FSU Master Craftsman Studio, Unveiling held on September 30, 2013 by the Tallahassee Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA), the City of Tallahassee and Leon County Government

## Continue down Jefferson across Adams St. and veer to the left onto the sidewalk in front of City Hall. Turn (north) right and continue up the stairs to the City Hall Courtyard.

28. <u>Tallahassee Wind Sculpture</u> by Michio Ihara, Stainless Steel, 1989 South Courtyard of City Hall

Veer right in the City Hall Courtyard, walking northeast around the perimeter of the building and back towards Adams. Turn north (left) at the entrance of City Hall

- 29. City of Tallahassee Memorial, City Hall
- 30. USS Tallahassee Bell, Bronze, 1908 City Hall

### Cross Jefferson and continue north on Adams. Turn west (left) onto College. Cross Duval and turn south onto Kleman Plaza.

- 32. <u>iHeartTally Mural</u> by Cosby Hayes, 2017, Kleman Plaza parking garage entrance
